DOGE on the Treasury money trail

The Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) said that a total of \$4.7 trillion worth of payments from the Treasury Department are almost impossible to trace because of missing account identification codes.

DOGE said the Treasury Department has assigned identification codes called Treasury Access Symbols (TAS), designed to note which account a Treasury payment is linked to, which DOGE said was a "standard financial process" for book keeping. However, the codes were not assigned for trillions of Dollars worth of payments as the field was considered optional, according to the agency.

"In the Federal Government, the TAS field was optional for ~\$4.7 trillion in payments and was often left blank, making traceability almost impossible," DOGE stated on the social media platform X. "As of Saturday, this is now a required field, increasing insight into where money is actually going. Thanks to U.S. Treasury for the great work." (More)
